Revised Food Policy

In light of the progress made since the original policy was written in 2006, this revised policy has been formulated to further extend progress in ensuring Hanson makes progress in promoting the health and wellbeing of our students and staff.

Aim

To ensure that all aspects of food and nutrition in school promotes the health and wellbeing of students, staff and visitors to the school.

To encourage life- long informed choices can be made, about healthy eating.

Objectives

1. To continue to review the formal curriculum to ensure information relating to food and nutrition in different lesson areas is consistent and up to date.
2. To continue to work closely with the school caterer to deliver good quality food which meets the statutory regulations (National Nutritional Standards for School Lunches which were phased in by 2019 which cover all foods served in schools).
3. Ensure that teachers who are taking responsibility for food in the classroom, have basic food hygiene training.
4. To encourage students to rehydrate during the school day.
5. To reduce amount of unhealthy food brought into school by students.


