### Entry Profile for your course:-

You will enjoy this course if you are caring, enjoy working with children and completing coursework more than exams.

Equally, if you like to work independently, rather than being taught in a formal classroom setting, you have more flexibility in how you approach your work.

Students also study child care learning and development because of the work experience element, where they can apply the ideas learnt in class. You will develop your knowledge, understanding and skills in contexts that are directly relevant to employment situations, thereby enhancing your employability within the care and health sector.

### Entry Requirements:-

To be eligible, you will need to have at least 5 GCSEs grade A\*-C.

### How will my course be assessed:-

Students will be assessed by coursework assignments.

Each unit is awarded a Pass (6 points)/Merit (12 points)/Distinction (18 points). These points added together give the final grade.

Students need satisfactory completion of 6 or 12 assessed units of work to gain either the full diploma or the subsidiary diploma. Students also have to complete 100 hours of work placement
