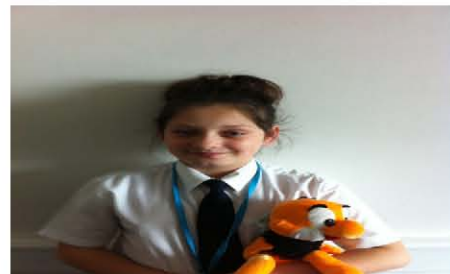
## Cooking crepes!
