Tuesday—Ukrainian

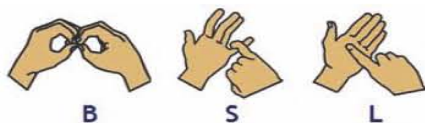
On Tuesday, Students enjoyed taking part in a lunchtime Ukrainian session. Thank you to Mrs Middleton.
